Welcome of New Administrator

We were blessed by the presence of Fr. Saju K., our New Administrator and newly appointed teachers along with newly admitted students in Carmel Family. Fr. Stenin (Our Manager), Fr. Varghese (Our Principal) and Sr. Beena (Our Vice Principal) welcomed them all on 1st July.

New Staff Representatives

On 6th July just after the summer vacations, election for the post of Staff Representatives was conducted. Mr. Pranav Prakash Shrivastava and Mrs. Meenakshi Purohit were elected as new SR's. Former SR's Mr. Pankaj Kothiya & Mrs. Priya Rajput along with Manager and Principal welcomed and wished them. New representatives thanked the former representatives for their dedicated services.

Infrastructure

The upgraded infrastructure facilities include renovated parents lobby in front of office, new parents waiting lounge, separate room for CBSE Coordinator, centralized RO Water Plant, New Parking Area is developed for vehicles, RO drinking water on each floor and New Boys and Girls washrooms on each floor. Currently, we have a Physics lab, Chemistry lab, Bio lab, and Computer lab with internet facilities and a fully equipped library. The use of smart classes has become an integral part of imparting education.

CMI General counsellor visit

In order to provide orientation for improved school operations, Rev Fr. Martin Mallath (General councellor for Education & Media communication, CMI), had visited our school. During his address to the teachers he highlighted the ethos of St. Kuriakose Elias Chavara.

School Assessment

As per the decision taken by St. Paul's Society, Bhopal, Christ College, NCR affiliated to Christ University, Bangalore formed a team of members to organize a two-day internal assessment for quality improvement in all CMI schools (CBSE and MP Board recognized) of Madhya Pradesh. In the two-day internal assessment at Carmel School, Kareli on 15th & 16th October, 2024 the response regarding school education and management during a detailed discussion with teachers, students, parents and fourth class employees was taken, and Report was prepared in which 85% score was achieved by our school along with suggestions for improvement.

School Achievements

Academic Achievements

We are proud to acknowledge that we had very good result. We are happy to share the details of the commendable performance of our students.

- In class XII, 61 Students appeared for examination. There were 43 first division students with 18 distinctions.
- In class X, 125 students appeared for examination. 7 students acquired more than 90% marks, 15 students were in the category of more than 80% marks, overall 77 students passed with first division.

Teachers' Achievements

Carmel Family consists of well-trained, experienced and dedicated faculty, administrative and supporting staff.

- Staying updated is the key to success in any field especially in the field of education. Teachers including Principal constantly strive to stay updated by attending workshops and training programmes both offline and online to serve the organization in a better way.
- On 13th April, one day offline training was conducted by CBSE in the school premises on "Happy Classroom" by Mr. Abhay Sontakke (Principal, Mt. Literra School, Nagpur). Our 54 teachers were enriched.
- Teachers' enrichment programme on "POCSO Act & Child Protection Act" was conducted by Dr. Sister
 Johncy (Counseling Psychologist) and Sister Asha Paul (Advocate, Bar Council Member, Supreme
 Court) just after the summer vacation on 24th June. On 25th June Dr. Fr. Davis George guided our
 teachers on "Soft Skills".
- All our teachers had undergone various CBP (both online and offline). Our PRT's underwent a specific training on implementation of HPC upto class II at Chavara Vidyapeeth, Narsinghpur.
- Internal yoga training was conducted among all staff members. On 29th June we along with our students participated in International Yoga Day under guidance of our Physical Instructors. Fr. Stenin and Fr. Saju motivated and asked them to make it a part of their daily routine.

Sahodaya achievements

We had conducted CBSE Sahodaya cluster level athletics competition successfully and got a good response from all 5 associated schools. We have showcased outstanding performances in a series of Sahodaya cluster & district level competitions held at various venues achieving remarkable results across multiple events.

Outstanding Achievements

- Shrestha Nagariya, a student of class VII of the school, increased the pride of the school and Kareli city by securing third place in the International UC Mass Competition held in Delhi, for which Shrestha Nagariya was awarded.
- Our Scout & Guide presented Yoga formation at Stadium, Narsinghpur during Republic Day celebration. Also on 1st November on the occasion of Gourav Divas they performed skit for awareness on 'Swacchta and Nasha Mukti' at Old Galla Mandi, Kareli.
- Our Band team performed at Narsinghpur on Independence Day and on Republic Day during inauguration of Bhagat Singh Statue at Old Galla Mandi, Kareli.

Sports Achievements

<u>Carmel Students Media</u> Comprising of talented students and dedicated Mentor staff, our student Media Team of 20 students has been instrumental in showcasing our school's journey through their exceptional reporting, photography, and videography skills. They conducted insightful interviews with dignitaries such as Member of parliament, Christ Assessment team, experts of subjects, principals, teachers, students, parents and public outside.

<u>House visit</u> Along with Fr Varghese, teachers visited the families of students. Parents were very happy to welcome them and held fruitful discussion on the studies of their wards.

SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

With the objective of integration of skills and concepts and for expressing the student's innate creativity, various celebrations, social activities, co-curricular activities, and intra-school activities were held.

Carmel Day (Matru Diwas) and Investiture Ceremony

Further we had special prayers and students performed cultural programs.
- After digital cabinet elections on 6th July, the investiture ceremony was organized to welcome the newly appointed student council members on Carmel Day. Mrs. Susheela Mamar, President, Nagar Palika, Kareli administered the oath to the students. The programme was concluded by the distribution of saplings to the parents and students.

<u>Guru Poornima</u> On 20th July Mr. Sanjeev Pandey (senior teacher CM Rise School, Kareli) as Chief Guest of the day expressed his views and told the importance of GURU in everyone's life. Students offered Shrifal to all the Gurus.

<u>Post Office Visit</u> Our 6th class students along with Principal and teachers visited Post office, Kareli as part of their Hindi Activity.

<u>Independence Day</u> The chief guests were Mrs. Sushma Verma, Retired Supervisor Mahila avam Bal Vikas and Fr. Jose (Civil Engineer CMI) who hoisted the flag. Scout and guide, red cross and house troops saluted the flag. Just after this PT display & March past competitions were conducted, and cultural programmes were performed.

Educational Trip Our students of Class XII visited Sanchi Milk Plant, St. Alousius College, Indian Cofee House, Jabalpur accompanied by their Subject teachers on 23rd August.

On an onus thought of remembering an exemplary leader Dr. Radhakrishnan on his birthday the Teachers Day was celebrated. In his address, the institution manager Fr. The sports and programs was inaugurated by the chief guest with lighting the Olympic torch. Under cultural programs patriotic dance, yoga presentation, self-defense judo, Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat, prayer dance, Fit India dance etc. and under games, various types of races like jellyfish race, butterfly race, collective ball race, basketball race, octopus race, gorilla race, 400 m relay race, etc. were organized in a colourful manner. The annual magazine of Carmel School 'The Spirit of Carmel' was released by the chief guest. Appreciation Award comprising a medal and cash amount by Paliwal family (Chanwarpatha) and Bishop Clemens Award by St. Paul Society are given to the students securing first and second positions from the school in CBSE 10th and 12th board examinations respectively. working models related to subjects like Mathematics, Science, Social Science, Computer etc., whose exhibition was organised in the school premises.
